

How is hearing tested in young children?

Testing bub's ear health and hearing is simple and easy to do.

Step
1



A Hearing Australia clinician will ask some questions about bub's ears and general health.

Step
2



We will ask questions about how bub hears at home and how well they yarn.

Step
3



We will look at bub's ears to check they are healthy or for any problems.

Step
4



Bub will have a hearing check. This may include playing games.

Step
5



If bub has ear disease or trouble hearing, they will get treatment and support.

*The Hearing Assessment Program is funded by the Australian Government. All services provided under this program are free of charge. A hearing check includes a number of age-appropriate tests of hearing and middle ear function.
